## Cutting

#### WOF = Width of Fabric

### Fabric A, fussy cut:

- (1)  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square, centerered on a figure for Block 2a (center block)
- (4)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, each centerered on a figure, for Block 1

### Fabric B, cut:

(1) 1½" x WOF; subcut (2) 1½" x 5½"

### Fabrics C, D, F, and G, cut from each:

(1) 7½" x 5½" tall

### Fabric E, cut:

- (2) 3½" x WOF; subcut (16) 3½" squares
- (4) 21/2" x WOF, for binding

### Fabric H, cut:

- (3) 3" x WOF; subcut (10) 3" x 9½"
  - (10) 2½" squares
- (3) 2" x WOF; subcut
  - (5) 2" x 121/2"
  - (10) 2" x 4"
  - (5) 2" x 21/2" pieces
- (3) 1½" x WOF; subcut
  - (10) 1½" x 5½"
  - (5) 1½" x 2½"
- (20) 11/2" squares

#### Fabric I, cut:

- (1) 71/4" x WOF; subcut
  - (4) 71/4" squares
  - (5) 1" wide x 21/2" tall
  - (10) 2" wide x 1" tall
- (3) 1½" x WOF; subcut (10) 1½" x 9½"

#### Fabric J, cut:

(2) 6%" x WOF; subcut (8) 6%" squares

#### Instructions

Use a ¼" seam allowance throughout. Sew all pieces with right sides together and raw edges even using matching thread. Press after each seam

#### **Block 1 Construction**

1. Cut each **Fabric I** 7¼" square in half diagonally twice to make a total of 16 quarter-square triangles (QSTs). **Fig. 1**

2. Sew a Fabric I 7¼" QST to all 4 edges of a Fabric A 6½" square as shown. Make 4 Unit 1 (9" square unfinished). Fig. 2

3. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of all Fabric E 3½" squares. Arrange 2 marked Fabric E squares on opposite corners of a Fabric J 6%" square as shown. Stitch along marked lines. Trim seam allowances to ¼". Press corners away from Fabric J. Repeat on remaining corners. Make 8. Cut each in half diagonally, parallel to the seams, creating 2 Unit 2, for a total of 16 Unit 2 (67%" x 67%" x 9¾" unfinished). Fig. 3

**4.** Sew a Unit 2 to all 4 edges of each Unit 1 to complete a block. Make 4 Block 1 (12½" square unfinished). **Fig. 4**

#### **Block 2 Construction**

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5. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of all **Fabric H** 2½" and 1½" squares. **Fig. 5**


6. Arrange 2 marked **Fabric H** 1½" squares on opposite corners of a **Fabric I** 1½" x 9½" pieces as shown. Stitch along marked lines. Trim seam allowances to ¼". Press corners out. Make a total of 10 Unit 3 (9½" x 1½" unfinished). **Fig. 6**

7. Sew a **Fabric H** 3" x 9½" to top of a Unit 3. Add a **Fabric H** 2" x 4" piece to the left side. Make a total of 5 Unit 4a (11" x 4" unfinished). In the same manner, make 5 Unit 4b noting orientation of the unit and pieces. **Fig. 7**

8. Sew a Fabric I 1" x 2½" piece to the righthand side of a Fabric H 1½" x 2½" piece. Add Fabric I 1" x 2" pieces to top and bottom of unit. Make a total of 5 Unit 5 (2" x 3½" unfinished). Fig. 8

9. Sew a Fabric H 2" x 2½" piece to bottom of a Unit 5. Add a Fabric H 1½" x 5½" piece to the right-hand side. Make a total of 5 Unit 6 (3" x 5½" unfinished). Fig. 9

**10.** Stitch 2 **Fabric B** 1½" x 5½" pieces to the right and left sides of the **Fabric A** 5½" fussycut square, noting orientation, to complete Unit 7 (7½" x 5½" unfinished). **Fig. 10**

11. Arrange 2 marked **Fabric H** 2½" squares on bottom corners of Unit 7 as shown. Stitch along marked lines. Trim seam allowances to ¼". Press corners towards **Fabric H** to complete Unit 8a (7½" x 5½" unfinished). **Fig. 11**

12. In the same manner, add Fabric H 21/2" squares to **Fabrics C. D. F.** and **G**  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces to make 1 each Units 8b-8e. Fig. 12



13. Sew a Unit 8a between a Fabric H 1½" x 5½" piece and a Unit 6. Add a Unit 4a to top and Unit 4b to bottom. Stitch a Fabric H 2" x 12½" piece to left side to complete Block 2a (121/2" square unfinished) Fig. 13





## Quilt Top Assembly

- 15. Noting Quilt Layout diagram (page 6), arrange the blocks in 3 rows of 3.
- **16.** Sew the blocks into rows, pressing towards Block 2.
- 17. Sew the rows together, and press all seams in the same direction, to complete the guilt top (36½" x 36½" unfinished).

### Finishing

- 18. Sew together the (4) 2½" Fabric E binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- 19. Cut the backing fabric to measure 42" square. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and guilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and guilt or tie as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the guilt top after guilting is completed.
- 20. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of guilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along guilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to 1/4" and press open. Finish sewing binding to guilt.
- 21. Turn the binding to the back of the guilt and hand stitch in place.
