## Additional Recommendations

- $100 \%$ cotton thread in colors to match
- 100 " $\times 107^{\prime \prime}(2.54 \mathrm{~m} \times 2.72 \mathrm{~m})$ batting
- Optional: Starch/starch alternative, removable fabric marker, cardstock or template plastic


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## Cutting

## WOF = Width of Fabric <br> HST = Half-square Triangle <br> OST = Quarter-square Triangle

- Read instructions all the way through before beginning to cut to understand where cut pieces are used and decide how you would like to cut pieces with alternate cutting methods.
- Press fabrics with starch or starch alternative and allow to dry before cutting fabric.
- Fussy-cut pieces will have bias edges so handle carefully to avoid stretching or distorting.
- Cut fabric in order listed, placing pieces with fussy cut motifs first to take advantage of all motifs available, then cut pieces that do not require specific motif placement.
- If desired, mark all pieces to be cut with a removable fabric marker before cutting.


## From Fabric A, cut:

(6) $5^{1 / 2 "} \times 5^{1 / 2 "}$ bias squares, centered on your desired motifs
(2) $8^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}} \times 8^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$, then cut in half on both diagonals to yield 8 OSTs OR follow alternate OST fussy-cutting method at right if you would like to feature mostly background fabric

## From Fabric B, cut:

(4) $5^{1 / 2 "} \times 5^{1 / 2 "}$ bias squares, centered on your desired motifs
(4) $8 \frac{1}{4} " \times 8^{1 / 1} 4^{\prime \prime}$, then cut in half on both diagonals to yield (16) OSTs OR follow alternate OST fussy-cutting method at right if you would like to feature mostly background fabric
(2) 3 " $\times$ WOF, cut (4) 3 " $\times 13^{11 / 4 " ~(o r ~ c u t ~ i n d i v i d u a l ~ r e c t a n g l e s ~ a s ~ d e s i r e d ~ f r o m ~}$ remaining fabric)

## Alternate OST Fussy-cutting Method:

Note: If you would like your Fabric A and Fabric B OSTs to show mostly background as in the virtual image, follow this alternate cutting method, rather than cutting squares and then cutting into OSTs:

- On sturdy paper or template plastic, draw an $8^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ square, then draw 2 intersecting diagonal lines from corner to corner.
- Cut on the lines and label 1 triangle as your 81/4" OST template. Mark a line parallel to the long side of the triangle.
- Use the template to cut the required amount of OSTs from the fabric after other cuts are complete, making sure to keep the marked line parallel to the selvages of the fabric to keep the long edge of the triangle on the more stable lengthwise grain of the fabric.


## From Fabrics C, G, I, L, M, Q, Y, AA, and AB, cut from each:

(3) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(8) 3 " $\times 13^{11 / 4} "$

## From Fabric D, cut:

(6) $5^{1 / 2 "} \times 5^{1 / 2 "}$ bias squares, centered on your desired goldfish motifs
(3) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF, subcut
(8) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{1 / 4} 4^{"}$ (or cut individual rectangles as desired from remaining fabric)

## From Fabric E, cut:

(8) 3 " $\times$ WOF, subcut
(8) 3 " $\times 13^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$
(8) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$
(8) 3 " $\times 81 / 2 "$

## From Fabric F, fussy cut:

(3) $5^{1 / 2 "} \times 5^{1 / 2 "}$ bias squares, centered on your desired bunny motifs

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From Fabrics H, P, T, W, and AD, cut from each:
(2) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$

## From Fabric J, cut:

(12) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF, subcut
(8) $3^{3} \times 13^{11 / 4} 4^{\prime}$
(16) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 11 "$
(16) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$

## From Fabrics $K$ and $U$, cut from each:

(4) 3" x WOF; subcut
(8) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1 / 2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$
(8) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{1 / 2 "}$

## From Fabric N, cut:

(2) 8 " $\times 8$ ", then cut each in half diagonally once to yield 4 HSTs

## From Fabric O:

(1) $8^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$, then cut in half on both diagonals to yield (4) QSTs
(4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{1 / 4} 4$

## From Fabrics $\mathbf{R}$ and $\mathbf{Z}$, cut from each:

(4) 8 " $\times 8$ ", then cut each in half diagonally once to yield 8 HSTs (if desired, cut squares in opposite directions to maintain directional print when quilt top is assembled)

## From Fabric S, cut:

(3) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(6) 3 " $\times 10^{1 / 2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$
(6) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$

## From Fabric V, cut:

(2) 3 " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
(4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{11 / 2 "}$

## From Fabric X, cut:

(4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF, subcut
(4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$
(4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$
(4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$

## From Fabric AC, cut:

(6) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(12) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1 / 2 "} 2^{\prime \prime}$
(12) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{11 / 2 "}$

From Fabric AE, AF, and AG, cut from each:
(5) $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF

## From Fabric AH, cut:

enough $2^{1} / 2$ " -wide* bias strips for 380 " ( 9.6 m ) of bias binding *or your preferred cut width for bias binding

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## Instructions

Note: All seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press seam allowances open or as directed.

## Block Construction

1. Sew Fabric AC $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ pieces to opposite sides of a fussy-cut Fabric A $5^{1 / 2 "}$ square, with the top of the motif following the arrow to orient the motif right-reading. Press towards Fabric AC. Sew the Fabric AC 3" $\times 10^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ pieces to the remaining sides and press in the
 the quantities and fabric combinations of blocks shown. (Fig. 1a \& Fig. 1b)

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2. Sew a Fabric E $3^{\prime \prime} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ " piece to one short side of a Fabric A $8^{1 / 1} \mathbf{4}^{\prime \prime}$ OST as shown. Press towards Fabric E, then sew a Fabric E 3" $\times 11^{\prime \prime}$ piece to the remaining short side and press in the same manner to complete an A Triangle Unit. Repeat to make the quantities and fabric combinations of triangle units shown. (Fig. 2a \& Fig. 2b)

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3. Arrange $3 \mathbf{A}$ Blocks and $4 \mathbf{A}$ Triangle Units in 3 diagonal rows as shown, making sure fussy-cut motifs are right-reading. Sew together in rows, pressing towards the darker fabric, then sew rows together, nesting seam allowances, to complete an A Center Unit. Make 2 total. (Fig. 3a)

In the same manner, make $2 \mathbf{B}$ Center Units using the $\mathbf{B}$ and $\mathbf{D}$ Blocks and the B Triangle Units and $1 \mathbf{F}$ Center Unit using the $\mathbf{F}$ Blocks and $\mathbf{O}$ Triangle Units. (Fig. 3b and 3c)

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4. Sew 4 Fabric E 3 " $\times 13^{1 / 4}$ " strips to the top and bottom of both $\mathbf{A}$ Center Units, log cabin style, as shown in Figure 4.

5. Continue adding $3^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{1 / 4}$ " strips as in step 4 , using the fabrics listed in the Column Layout diagram (page 10), to make 2 each of $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{B}$ Columns, and $1 \mathbf{F}$ Column.
6. Sew 2 Fabric Z 8" HSTs each to the top and bottom of both $\mathbf{A}$ Columns as shown in the Column Layout diagram. Repeat to add Fabric $\mathbf{R}$ to both BColumns, and Fabric $\mathbf{N}$ to the $\mathbf{F}$ Column as shown, keeping directional prints oriented right-reading (or in rainbow order) if you cut the HSTs in that manner. Trim the sides of each column even with the raw edges of the QSTs in the Triangle Units, as shown by the blue line. Each column will finish approximately $14^{1 / 2 "}$ " wide $\times 99$ " long including seam allowances.

## Quilt Top Assembly

Follow the Quilt Layout diagram (page 11) while assembling the quilt. Press seam allowances towards the Sashing Strips. Measure the Column height before cutting and adding sashing and adjust measurements if necessary to match your measurements.\}
7. Sew the Fabric AE $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips together end to end and cut 2 strips 99" long for vertical sashing. Repeat with the Fabric AF and AG strips.
8. Fold the vertical sashing strips and the Columns in half through the length to find and mark the centers.
9. Matching ends and centers carefully, sew the columns and vertical sashing strips together as shown, making sure columns are oriented with fussy-cut block centers right-reading. Note: The column edges will be on the bias and are easily stretched. For best results, pin the sashing on top of a column, and sew with the sashing on top against the presser foot, and the column on the bottom toward the feed dogs.

## Finishing

10. Sew the $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric AH bias binding strips together end-to-end. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
11. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
12. Leaving an $8 "$ tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12 " from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4$ " and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
13. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
