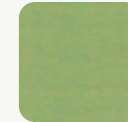

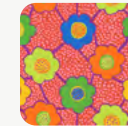

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 82" x 92" (2.08m x 2.34m) batting



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CUTTING

WOF = Width of Fabric

Fabric B, cut:

- (13) 3" x WOF; subcut
- (168) 3" x 3"
- (7) 2½" x WOF for inner border

Fabric C, cut:

- (8) 7" x WOF for outer border

Fabric D, cut:

- (9) 2½" x WOF for binding

INSTRUCTIONS

All seam allowances are ¼". Press seams as directed by arrows in diagrams.

Block Construction

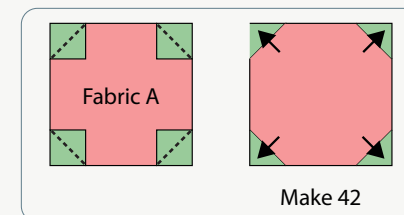
- 1 Draw a diagonal line on one side of each **Fabric B** 3" x 3" square. Technically, there is no wrong side to shot cotton, so the marked side becomes the wrong side.

- 2 Pin a marked **Fabric B** square in each corner of a precut **Fabric A** 10" charm square as shown, noting orientation of lines. Sew on the lines, trim the seam allowance to ¼", and press out towards the raw edge of the block. Trim and square to 10" x 10" if needed. Repeat with the remaining **Fabric A** squares to make (42) Blocks.

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QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY

- 3 Referring to the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 5), sew the blocks together into 7 rows, with (6) blocks in each row. To make the quilt exactly as shown, pay careful attention to the quilt image and lay out the blocks for each row in advance before sewing. Press the seams in each row in alternating directions so seams will nest.
- 4 Sew the rows together, nesting seam allowances, to complete the quilt center. Press all row seams down.
- 5 Sew the **Fabric B** 2½" x WOF strips together end to end, to make 1 continuous strip. From it, cut (2) side borders 67" long and (2) top/bottom borders 61½" long.
- 6 Sew the **Fabric B** side borders to the left and right sides of the quilt center, matching ends and centers. Press towards **Fabric B**, then sew the top and bottom borders to the top and bottom in the same way. Press.
- 7 Repeat steps 5 and 6, using the **Fabric C** 7" x WOF strips, to make and add 74½" long side borders and 71" long top and bottom borders, to complete the quilt top.

FINISHING

- 8 Sew together the 2½" **Fabric D** binding strips end to end. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- 9 Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
- 10 Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- 11 Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
