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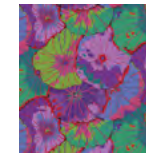

Additional Recommendations

- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 76" x 86" (1.93m x 2.18m) batting
- Template Plastic or Acrylic Tumbler Template such as Marti Michell One-Derful Tumbler Template

Cutting

Notes:

- If using the printed tumbler template included in this pattern, print the template pages at 100% and measure the 1" box to confirm accurate template size. Trace onto template plastic and cut out on the lines. It is worth the time to use a permanent marker to label templates with size and pattern name, just in case they are separated from the original pattern.
- To conserve fabric, rotate the template after each cut, lining the diagonal edge of the template up with the cut edge of the fabric.

Shot Cotton Solid FQs, from each of 35 FQs cut:

- (1) 6" x 20" for a total of 35 strips; sub-cut a total of (64) 6" tumblers
- (1) 4" x 20" for a total of 35 strips; sub-cut a total of (156) 4" tumblers
- (18) 2½" x 20" strips for scrappy binding

Shot Cotton Stripes FQs, from each of 24 FQs cut:

- (2) 5" x 20" for a total of 48 strips; sub-cut a total of (120) 5" tumblers
- (1) 3" x 20" for a total of 24 strips; sub-cut a total of (108) 3" tumblers

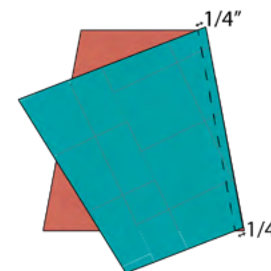
Sewing

Note: This quilt is pieced directly into rows. Use a ¼" seam allowance throughout. Sew all pieces with right sides together and raw edges even using matching or neutral thread. Press seams open.

Row Assembly:

1. Randomly arrange (16) 6" solid tumblers in a row, alternating every other tumbler so they nest and create a straight line. Align edges of tumblers, offsetting ends ¼" so the seam starts and stops where the tumbler edges cross. Press seam open.

Repeat and sew the remaining tumblers for Row 1 into sets of two (2). Continue sewing the tumbler sets together until you have a single row with (16) 6" tumblers.

Make a total of (4) 6" x 72" rows.

Row 1 - Make 4

2. Randomly arrange (20) 5" stripe tumblers in a row, alternating every other tumbler so they nest and create a straight line. Align edges of tumblers, offsetting ends ¼" so the seam starts and stops where the tumbler edges cross. Press seam open.

Repeat as in Step 1, making a total of (6) 5" x 72" rows.

Row 2 - Make 6

- Randomly arrange (26) 4" solid tumblers in a row, alternating every other tumbler so they nest and create a straight line. Align edges of tumblers, offsetting ends $\frac{1}{4}$ " so the seam starts and stops where the tumbler edges cross. Press seam open.

Repeat as in Step 1, making a total of (6) 4" x 72" rows.

- Randomly arrange (36) 3" stripe tumblers in a row, alternating every other tumbler so they nest and create a straight line. Align edges of tumblers, offsetting ends $\frac{1}{4}$ " so the seam starts and stops where the tumbler edges cross. Press seam open.

Repeat as in Step 1, making a total of (3) 3" x 72" rows.

Quilt Top Assembly:

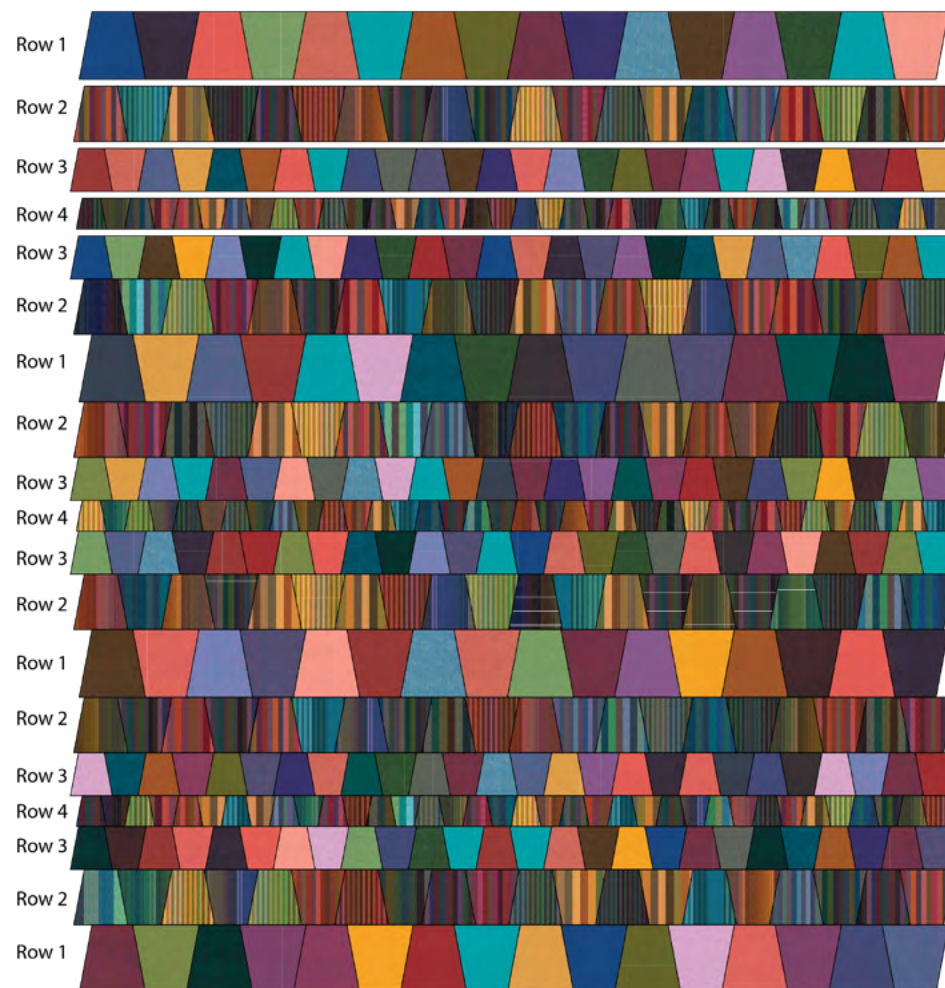
- Following the layout shown in **Figure 6** (right), arrange the rows as shown. Find the center of each row, place Rows 1 and 2, right sides together and pin from the center out, aligning edges of the rows. Stitch using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press all seams down.

Repeat for all remaining rows, pressing seams down as rows are sewn together.

Note: The left and right edges of the rows will be staggered. They will be trimmed after the quilt top is complete.

- Using the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 5), trim left and right sides of quilt. After trimming, the quilt top will measure 68" x 78".

Finishing

7. Sew together the (18) 2½" x 20" Shot Cotton Solid pieces end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open, then press the binding strip in half, wrong sides together. This will create a scrappy binding. Set aside until the quilt is ready for binding.
8. Once the quilt top is complete it is ready for quilting! Quilts can be sent out for longarm quilting or you can quilt it yourself. If sending the quilt out, it is important to discuss backing and batting requirements with the quilter to ensure they have everything needed to properly finish the quilt.

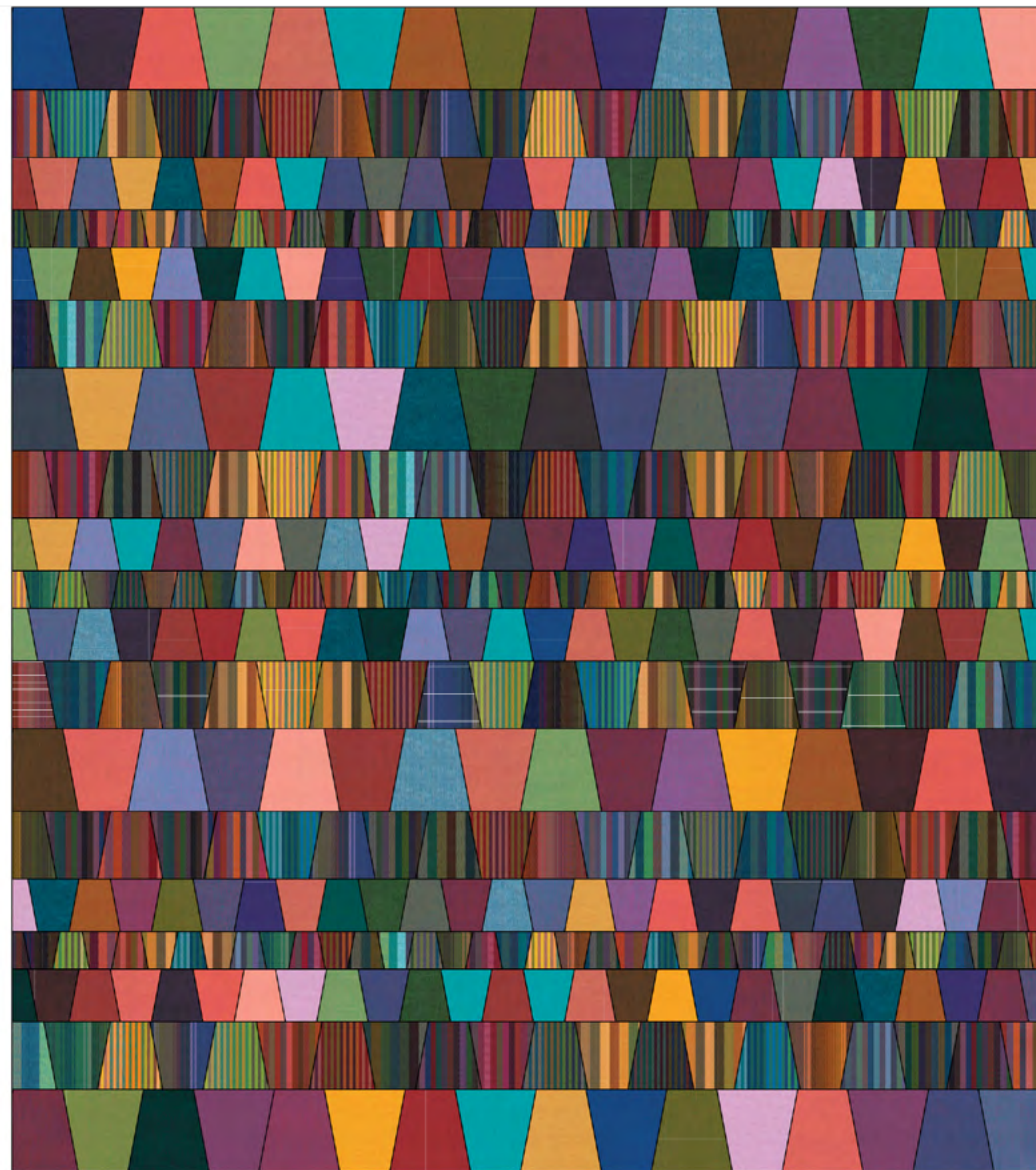
If quilting yourself and using 44" fabric for backing, choose your favorite method for piecing (taking time to remove selvages), then layer, baste and quilt. Once finished, trim excess batting and backing and bind according to your favorite method.

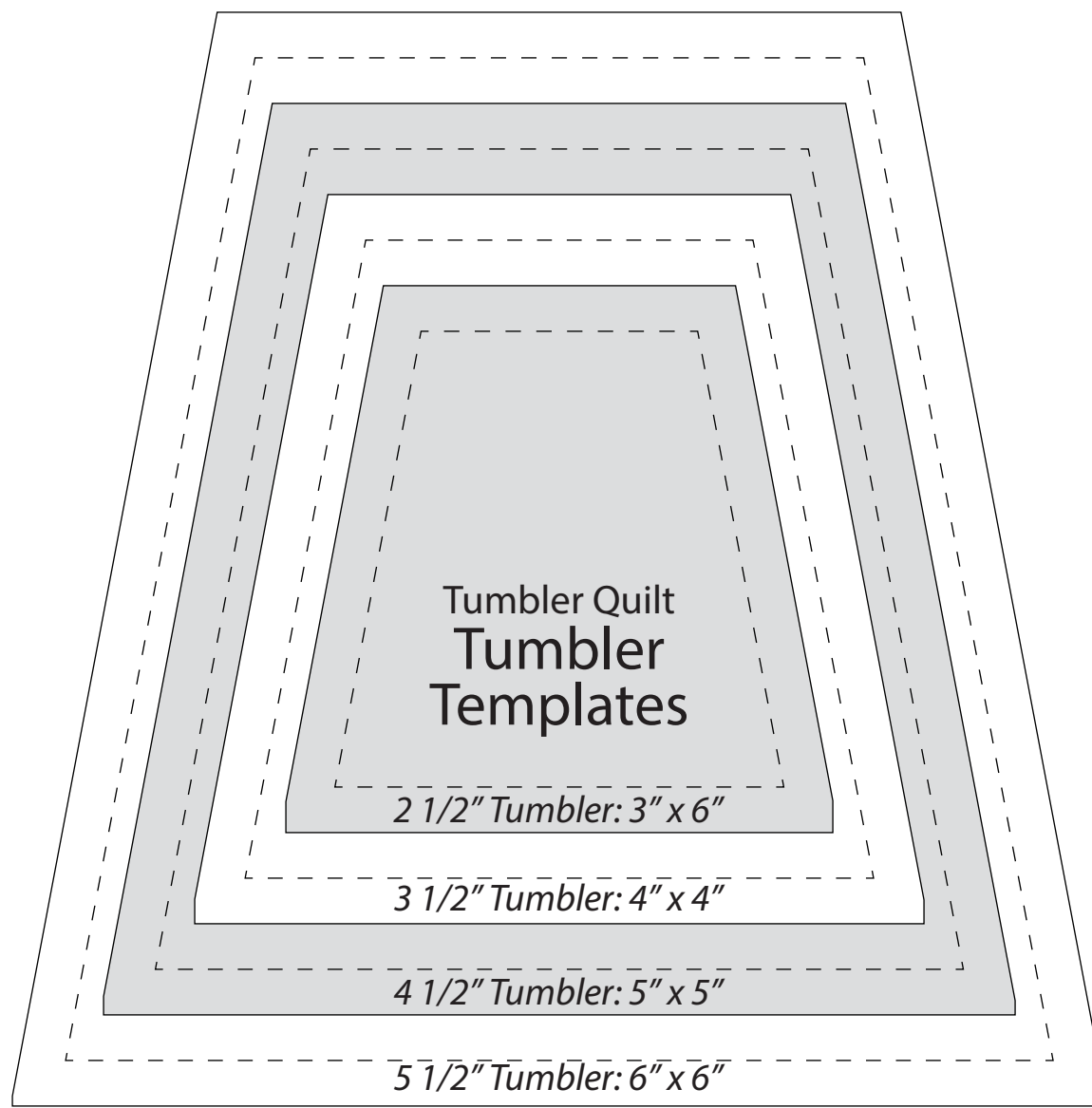
To complete binding by hand, it must first be machine sewn to the quilt top using the following steps:

Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers, matching raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the two loose ends meet, fold each side back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. The binding will naturally fold, wrong sides together, and lay along the quilt edge. Finish sewing binding to quilt. Turn and press the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.

If machine binding, complete the steps above only attach the binding to the BACK of the quilt, turn and press binding to the front of the quilt and machine stitch in place.

Quilt Layout





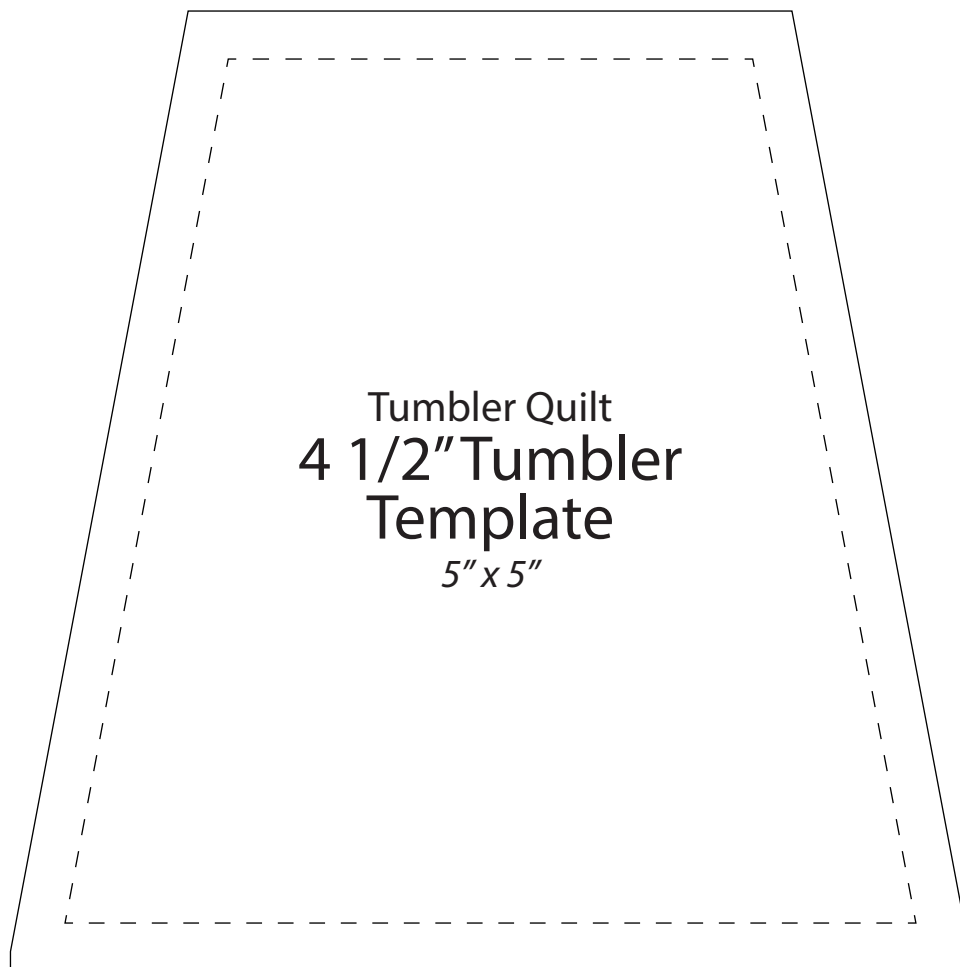

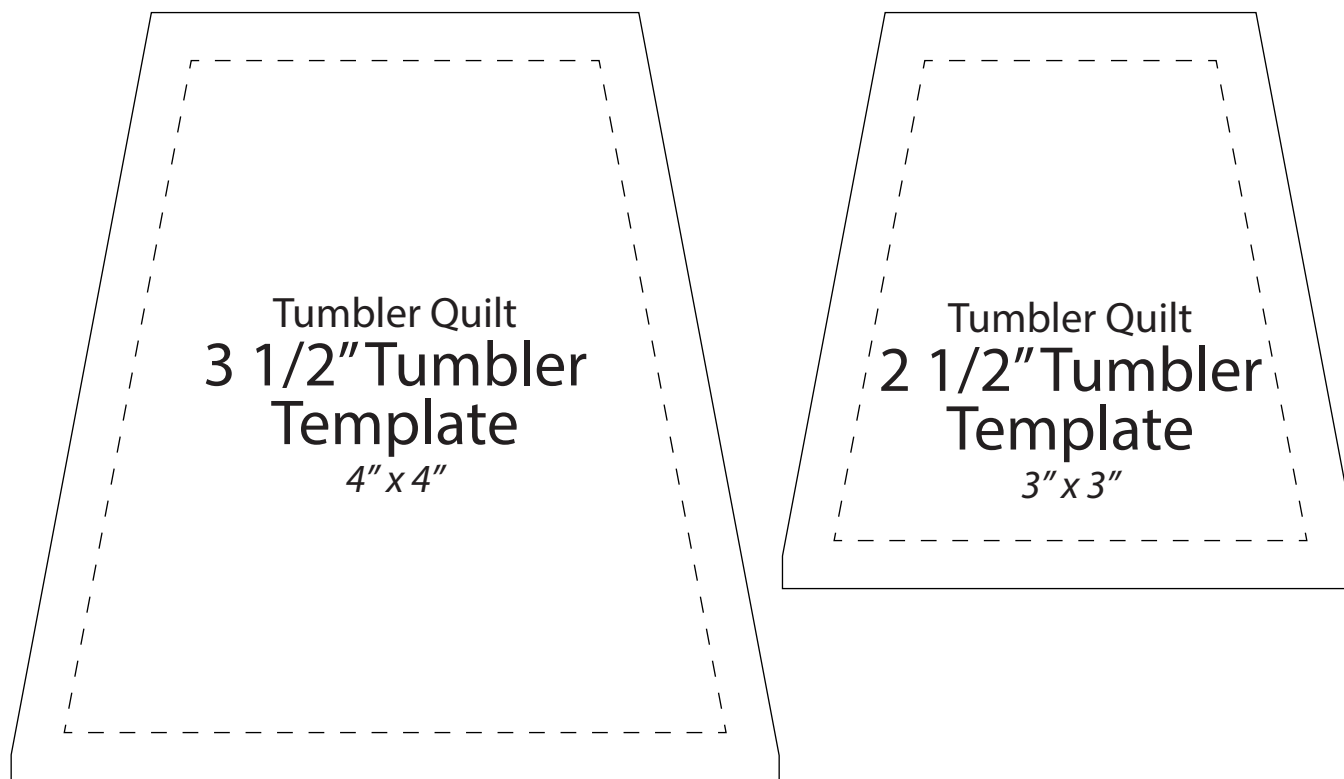
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
