Additional Recommendations

- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 83" x 101" (2.11m x 2.57m) batting

Cutting

From Fabric A cut:

(2) 15³/₈" x WOF; sub-cut

(4) 15% " squares. Sub-cut on both diagonals making (4) directional triangles from each square. Keep (4) Left side and (4) Right side triangles and (3) Top and (3) Bottom triangles as per the **Quilt Layout** diagram. From the remainder cut (2) 7% " squares. Place (1) 7% " fabric square right side up and cut once on the diagonal from the bottom-left corner to the top-right corner. Repeat with the second 7% " square cutting once on the diagonal from the bottom-right corner to top-left corner for a total of (4) triangles.

From Fabric B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, and M cut:

(1) 10½" x WOF; sub-cut (2) 10½" squares

From Fabric K, N, O, and P cut:

(1) 10½" x WOF; sub-cut (3) 10½" squares

From Fabric L cut:

(35) 11/2" x WOF

From Fabric Q cut:


(58) 1½" x WOF (9) 2½" x WOF for binding

Instructions

Sew with a ¼" seam allowance. Press all seams as directed by diagram arrows

Sew a Fabric Q 1¹/₂" x WOF to either side of a Fabric L 1¹/₂" x WOF to make a strip set. Press according to the diagram shown in Fig. 1. Make (27) strip sets. From each, cut (3) 3¹/₂" x 10¹/₂" units, for a total of (80) Sash Units. From the remainder of the strip sets cut a total of (49) 1¹/₂" x 3¹/₂" units and set aside as Unit A.






Sew a Fabric L 1¹/₂" x WOF to either side of a Fabric Q 1¹/₂" x WOF to make a strip set. Make (4) strip sets. From the strip sets cut a total of (98) 1¹/₂" x 3¹/₂" units and set aside as Unit B. (Fig. 2)







3. Sew (1) Unit A and (2) Unit B together as shown in Fig. 3 to make the Sash Block. Make (49) 3¹/₂" Sash Blocks.




- 4. Following the layout in Fig. 4 (below), sew the Sash Blocks and Sash Units together into (9) Sash Rows, labeling them 1 - 9.
- 5. Sew the 10¹/₂" squares together into diagonal rows with the remaining 31/2" x 101/2" Sash Units between each square and on either end of each diagonal row. Follow the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 5) for fabric placement.
- 6. Sew the Fabric A setting triangles to the ends of each row, using the arrows in the **Quilt Layout** diagram to indicate the direction of the print for the triangles.
- 7. Sew the Diagonal Rows and Sash Rows together in the order shown in the **Quilt Layout** diagram. Trim and square the quilt top to 74¹/₂" x 92¹/₂".

Finishing

- 8. Sew together (9) 2¹/₂" Fabric Q binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half with wrong sides together and set aside until the guilt is ready for binding.
- 9. Once top is complete it is ready for quilting! Quilts can be sent out for longarm guilting or you can guilt it yourself. If you are sending the guilt out, it is important to discuss backing and batting requirements with the guilter to ensure they have everything needed to properly finish the guilt.
- **10.** If quilting yourself and using 44" fabric for backing, choose your favorite method for piecing (taking time to remove selvedges), then layer, baste and guilt. Once finished, trim excess batting and backing and bind according to your favorite method.
- **11.** To complete binding by hand, it must first be machine sewn to the quilt top. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of guilt through all layers, matching raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the two loose ends meet, fold each side back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to 1/4" and press seam open. The binding will naturally fold, wrong sides together, and lay along the guit edge. Finish sewing binding to guilt. Turn and press the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.
- **12.** If machine binding, complete the steps above only attach the binding to the BACK of the quilt, turn and press binding to the front of the quilt and machine stitch in place.
