- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 76" x 84" (1.93m x 2.13m) quilt batting



Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric

Fabrics A, D, F, H, L, and N, cut:

Cut (1) 131/4" x WOF; sub-cut

- (1) 131/4" square (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 4 triangles),
- (4) 5½" squares
- (3) 51/4" squares (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 12 triangles)

Fabric B, cut:

Cut (1) 131/4" x WOF; sub-cut

- (2) 131/4" squares (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 8 triangles)
- (4) 5¼" squares (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 16 triangles)

Cut (2) 5½" x WOF; sub-cut

- (8) 51/2" squares
- (2) 51/4" squares (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 8 triangles)

Fabrics C, E, J, O, P, Q, R, S, and T, cut:

Cut (1) 131/4" x WOF; sub-cut

- (1) 13¼" square (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 4 triangles)
- (2) 5½" squares
- (2) 51/4" squares (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 8 triangles)

Fabrics G and I, cut:

Cut (1) 131/4" x WOF; sub-cut

- (2) 131/4" squares (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 8 triangles)
- (4) 51/4" squares (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 16 triangles)

Cut (1) 5½" x WOF; sub-cut

- (6) 51/2" squares
- (1) 51/4" square (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 4 triangles)

Fabric K, cut:

- (4) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; sewn together end to end and cut into
 - (2) 4½" x 66½" borders
- (8) 21/2" x WOF for binding

Fabric M, cut:

Cut (1) 131/4" x WOF; sub-cut

- (1) 131/4" square (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 4 triangles),
- (2) 5½" squares
- (2) 5¼" squares (cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 8 triangles)
- (7) 1½" x WOF; sewn together end to end and cut into
 - (2) 1½" x 74½"
 - (2) 11/2" x 681/2" borders

Fabric U, cut:

- (7) 1½" x WOF; sewn together end to end and cut into
 - (2) 1½" x 66½"
 - (2) 1½" x 64½" borders



Sewing Instructions:

Notes: Use a ¼" seam allowance throughout. Sew all pieces with right sides together and raw edges even. ALL prints are treated as non-directional. Not all 51/4" and 131/4" triangles are used.

Crosswalk Block Assembly

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner across the wrong side of (2) Fabric A 5½" squares. Draw a line ¼" on each side of the first line as shown in Fig. 1.

2. Arrange (1) marked **Fabric A** 5½" square right sides together with (1) Fabric D 5½" square, aligning all edges. Stitch on the outside drawn lines. Cut on the center line as shown in Fig. 2. Press both triangle sets open. Do not trim. Make a total of (4) Unit 1.

Unit 1

Draw a diagonal line, from corner to corner and perpendicular to the seam line, across the wrong side of (2) Unit 1. Draw a line ¼" on each side of first line as shown in Fig. 3. Arrange a marked Unit 1 right sides together with an unmarked Unit 1, nesting seam allowances, with fabrics alternating. Make (2) sets.






Make 2 stacks

4. Stitch on the outside drawn lines of one Unit 1 set from Step 3. Cut on the center line. Press both triangle sets open. Trim each to 41/2" square. Make a total of (4) Unit 2 as shown in Fig. 4.

Repeat 2 times for 4 units.




5. Stitch (1) Fabric A and (1) Fabric D 5¼" triangle together along short edges only as shown in Fig. 5. Make a total of (6) Unit 3 (4½" x 4½" x 6½" unfinished)




6. Stitch (1) Fabric A and (1) Fabric D 13¼" triangle together along short edges only as shown in Fig. 6. Make (1) Unit 4a and (1) Unit 4b (12%" x 12%" x 18¼" unfinished).




7. Arrange (4) Unit 2 and (6) Unit 3 in four (4) off-set rows as shown in Fig. 7. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together to complete Unit 5 (16½" wide x 16½" tall unfinished).



8. Sew Unit 4a and Unit 4b to the long edges of Unit 5 as shown in **Fig. 8** to complete a Crosswalk Block (16½" x 16½" unfinished).

9. Using the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 7) as a reference, make (15) additional Crosswalk Blocks with the fabric combinations noted on blocks.

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Quilt Top Assembly

- 10. Follow the Quilt Layout diagram (page 7) to arrange blocks in four (4) rows of four (4) blocks each. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together. Quilt center measures 64½" x 64½" (unfinished)
- **11.** Stitch **Fabric U** 1-½" x 64-½" borders to the left and right sides of quilt center. Add **Fabric U** 1-½" x 66-½" borders to top and bottom of quilt center.
- 12. Stitch Fabric K 4-½" x 66-½" borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- **13.** Stitch **Fabric M** 1-½" x 74-½" borders to the left and right sides of quilt. Add **Fabric M** 1-½" x 68-½" borders to top and bottom of quilt.

Finishing

- **14.** Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF **Fabric K** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open, then press binding strip in half, wrong sides together. Set aside until the quilt is ready for binding.
- **15.** Once the top is complete it is ready for quilting! Quilts can be sent out for longarm quilting or you can quilt it yourself. If you are sending the quilt out, it is important to discuss backing and batting requirements with the quilter to ensure they have everything needed to properly finish the quilt.
- **16.** If quilting yourself and using 44" fabric for backing, choose your favorite method for piecing (taking time to remove selvedges), then layer, baste and quilt. Once finished, trim excess batting and backing and bind according to your favorite method.

- 17. To complete binding by hand, it must first be machine sewn to the quilt top. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers, matching raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the two loose ends meet, fold each side back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. The binding will naturally fold, wrong sides together, and lay along the quit edge. Finish sewing binding to quilt. Turn and press the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.
- **18.** If machine binding, complete the steps above only attach the binding to the **BACK** of the quilt, turn and press binding to the front of the quilt then machine stitch in place
