

Additional Recommendations

- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 74" x 83" (1.88m x 2.11m) batting





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Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric LOF = Length of Fabric

Note: Label cut pieces with fabric letter for easier assembly.

Fabric A, fussy cut:

(4) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x LOF for outer border, aligning motifs as shown in the quilt image on page 1

Fabric B:

Trim panel to $33\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ ", centering the tree, and keeping the flowers at the base of the tree intact.

Fabric C, cut:

- (1) 3½" x WOF; subcut (4) 3½" squares
- (8) 21/2" x WOF for binding

Fabric D, cut:

(6) 31/2" x WOF

Fabric E, cut:

- (1) 8½" x WOF; subcut (4) 8½" squares
- (2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for stripsets

Fabric F, cut:

(4) 2" x WOF

Fabrics G and H, cut from each:

(2) 3½" x WOF for stripsets

Fabric I, cut:

(5) 11/2" x WOF

Instructions


Note: All seam allowances are ¼" unless otherwise noted. Sew pieces right sides together. Press after each seam, following arrows in diagrams for pressing direction. If needed, adjust border cut lengths as you assemble the quilt top.

- 1. Sew all the 2" Fabric F strips together end to end with straight seams. Cut (2) 2" x 42½" side borders and (2) 2" x 36½" top/bottom borders. Sew Fabric F side borders to the left and right sides of the Fabric B panel. Sew Fabric F top/bottom borders to the top and bottom edges of the panel.
- 2. Sew a **Fabric E** and a **Fabric G** 3½" strip to opposite long edges of a 3½" **Fabric H** strip, making sure the strip set measures 9½" high. Repeat to make a second strip set. Cut a total of (18) 3½"- wide segments from the 2 strip sets (**Fig. 1**).

3. Arrange 5 step 2 segments in a single column, noting fabric placement, as shown in the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 5). Sew the segments together along adjacent edges to make a side border. Press. Repeat to make a second side border. Sew side borders to left and right sides of the quilt center, noting fabric orientation.

Then arrange 4 step 2 segments in a single row, with a 3½" **Fabric C** square at the beginning and end of the row, as shown in the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 5.). Sew together along adjacent edges to make a top/bottom border. Repeat to make a second top/bottom border. Sew top/bottom borders to top and bottom edges of the quilt center, noting fabric orientation.

4. Sew all the 1½" Fabric I strips together end to end with straight seams. Cut (2) 1½" x 51½" side borders. Sew side borders to left and right sides of the quilt center. From the remaining continuous Fabric I strip, cut (2) 1½" x 44½" top/bottom borders. Sew top/bottom borders to top and bottom edges of the quilt center.



Make 2 strip sets. Cut (18) 3¹/₂" x 9¹/₂" segments.

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- 5. Sew all the 3½" Fabric D strips together end to end, with your preference of straight or diagonal seams. Cut (2) 3½" x 53½" side borders. Sew side borders to left and right sides of the quilt center. From the remaining continuous Fabric D strip, cut (2) 3½" x 50½" top/bottom borders. Sew top/bottom borders to top and bottom edges of the quilt center.
- 6. Measure the quilt top vertically and horizontally through the center. Trim 2 Fabric A 8½" by LOF strips to fit the sides (59½" long), and 2 to fit the top/bottom (50½" long, centering large floral motifs along the border lengths.
- 7. Sew Fabric A side borders to the left and right sides of the quilt center, noting orientation of the floral motifs. Sew 8½" Fabric E squares to each short end of the Fabric A top/bottom borders. Sew one top/bottom border to the upper edge, noting orientation of the floral motifs, and the other to the lower edge of the quilt center to complete the quilt top.

Finishing

- **8.** Sew together the 2½" **Fabric C** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- **9.** Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top after quilting is completed.
- 10. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to ½" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- **11.** Turn the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.
