(B) Brewed Bouquets	Pink	PWAK047.XPINK	½ yard (0.46m)
(C) Flowering Field	Blue	PWAK051.XBLUE*	¾ yard (0.34m)
(D) Seeds	Peony	PWCD012.XPEONY	¾ yard (0.34m)

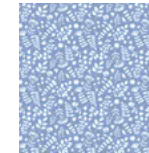
- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 34" x 34" (.86m x .86) quilt batting



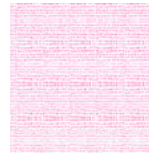

## Cutting

**WOF = Width of Fabric**

### Fabric A, fussy cut:

(13) 5" squares, each centered on a figure

### Fabric B, cut:

(4) 3½" x WOF; subcut  
 (2) 3½" x 28½" top/bottom borders  
 (2) 3½" x 23" side borders

### Fabric C, cut:

(4) 2½" x WOF for binding

### Fabric D, cut:

(2) 5" x WOF; subcut  
 (12) 5" squares

## Instructions

*Use a ¼" seam allowance throughout. Sew all pieces with right sides together and raw edges even using matching thread.*

## Quilt Top Assembly

1. Noting the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 4), arrange the **Fabric A** and **D** squares in 5 rows of 5 squares each, making sure each figure is right-reading.
2. Sew into rows. Press seams towards **Fabric A**.
3. Sew rows together, pinning at seam intersections and nesting seam allowances. Press all seams either down or open. Quilt center measures 23" x 23" (unfinished).
4. Stitch **Fabric B** 3½" x 23" borders to the right and left sides of the quilt center. Add **Fabric B** 3½" x 28½" borders to the top and bottom to complete the quilt top.

## Finishing

5. Sew together the (4) 2½" **Fabric C** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
6. Cut the backing fabric to measure 34" x 34". Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt or tie as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top after quilting is completed.

7. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
8. Turn the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.
